COVID-19 Safety Plan for Events

Any guests, vendors or gallery staff who have travelled internationally outside of Canada in the last two weeks or are experiencing a fever, sore throat or flu like symptoms in the past two weeks, or have been in contact with someone who has any of the above symptoms or confirmed positive for COVID-19, will NOT be permitted into The Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre.

COVID-19 Safety Procedures

The venue will be cleaned before and after each event. Hard surfaces & frequent touchpoints will be sanitized during events and the washrooms cleaned every two hours by our facilities maintenance team.

Directional and social distancing signage will be in place, we ask that it is adhered to.

We will offer hand sanitization stations at each entrance door.

All staff and vendors will be masked when onsite.

The Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre will continue to closely monitor the BC Provincial Health Officer's recommendations on group gathering sizes for weddings and special events. In the event that these capacities are increased or decreased from the current recommendation of 50 people, The Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre will follow these guidelines effective immediately.

We are encouraging a limited number of vendors at an event and will impose staggered delivery times and prescheduled drop offs to avoid overcrowding elevators and loading bays.

Expectations of Guests

All licensees will be required to sign a COVID-19 rental contract outlining our safety procedures and we ask that you share the information provided in this document with all of your guests and vendors.

Floor plans must be provided to the Venue Rentals Manager prior to an event for approval with 2 m spacing between 'bubbles' and family groups.

Masks are encouraged but optional for guests at The Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre. Guests are expected to fully comply with the above reduced event capacities and social distancing protocols at The Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre in accordance with B.C.'s Provincial Health Officer's recommendations.
