December 16, 2020, Whistler BC: From December 20 to January 24, the Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre (SLCC) will offer free admission, thanks to an innovative partnership with the Resort Municipality of Whistler (RMOW). Hours of operation will be Wednesday through Sunday, 10am – 5pm.

Making the Indigenous-owned museum and cultural centre admission free provides for an accessible, barrier-free learning opportunity to advance Truth and Reconciliation within the Resort community. Locals and guests will experience a deeper connection to the land and our shared history, as Cultural Ambassadors from both Nations weave together Indigenous knowledge and cultural sharing at this world-class facility. This important partnership between the RMOW and SLCC delivers on a number of Reconciliation policies outlined in Whistler's Official Community Plan (OCP).

"The SLCC provides a welcoming space to learn about, and honour, the culture, history and language of the Lil'wat and Squamish Nations," said Mayor Jack Crompton. "The Resort Municipality of Whistler is extremely proud to partner with the SLCC to provide this important learning and cultural experience with the aim of supporting steps to help move towards reconciliation at a community level."

The SLCC is also part of the COVID-19 Whistler Recovery Working Group's community initiative, "12 Days of Joy", a community calendar of twelve local activities to lift spirits, inspire outdoor time and create connection.
