

SLCC BREAKING GROUND ON \$1.96M IN UPGRADES STARTING APRIL 5

April 1, 2021, Whistler BC: Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre (SLCC) will be closed April 5-28 as upgrades are made to the concrete floors in the Great Hall and Gallery 2. Made possible by the Government of Canada and Province of BC's Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program Grant, the SLCC is honoured to receive \$1.96 million during the first round of recreation grant disbursements.

The renovations this grant enables will enhance and maintain the integrity of the physical building where our Skwxwú7mesh and Lílwat cultures meet, grow and are shared. Upgrades and renovations will ensure that the SLCC can continue to hold space for the cultures of both the Skwxwú7mesh Úxumixw and Lilwat7úl through activities, tours, community outreach, exhibits and key museum functions that meet – and exceed – our guests' expectations. Upgrades will also allow the facility to accept a wider range of exhibits and artifacts from the broader museum and heritage community that help increase understanding of Indigenous cultures as well as assist in repartition initiatives for Squamish and Lil'wat Nations.

Additional renovation activities that will be carried out include an overhaul of the HVAC/Air Conditioning/Heating system update control system (install energy efficient in-line boilers, retrofit select components to allow for passive technology air conditioning); refurbishing of floors and exterior; and upgrades to outdated sound, light, and surveillance equipment. Additional works to aid in culture and language revitalization include updating of all public facing interpretive/storyboard panels to include recent linguistic changes of Skwxwú7mesh Snichem (Squamish language) and Ucwalmícwts (Lil'wat language).

The SLCC will reopen Thursday, April 29, 2021 with temporary exhibit Boarder X on display in Gallery 2.
