

## **SLCC Wins 2021 National TIAC Indigenous Tourism Award**

ALGONQUIN ANISHNAABEG TERRITORY (Ottawa, ON) - The Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre located on the unceded shared territories of Skwxwú7mesh and Lil'wat7ul, Whistler, BC has been recognized with the 2021 National Indigenous Tourism Award presented by Indigenous Tourism Association of Canada (ITAC). The Annual Canadian Tourism Awards were hosted December 1, 2021, at The Westin Ottawa hotel in Ottawa, Ontario, by the Tourism Industry Association of Canada (TIAC).

SLCC Cultural Leader and voice of her generation, T'ec Georgina Dan of the Lil'wat Nation accepted the award on behalf of everyone at the SLCC. She graciously recognized the entire Ambassador family giving a moving acceptance speech from the heart to a deeply enamoured audience.

"It is truly amazing to be recognized, not only across Indigenous tourism, but Canadian tourism in general. We have about fifty Ambassadors, and 95% are Indigenous. We all have a story to tell, no matter what department you come from – Cultural sharing, Gift Shop, Cafe, Maintenance, Catering. Just like here in tourism, we all have inspiring stories to share." said T'ec Georgina Dan.
