Feature Exhibition *Ta na wa Yúus ta Stitúyntsam / skel7áwlh* opens Tuesday, April 30, 2024, at the Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre in Whistler, B.C.

April 26, 2024, Skwxwú7mesh / Lílwat7úl (Whistler, BC) - The Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre (SLCC) invites guests to experience its latest exhibition: **Ta na wa Yúus ta Stitúyntsaṁ** / **skel7áŵlh** (The person who protects the land / Steward of the land)

The SLCC's spring feature exhibition shares that the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw and Lilwat7úl have been caring for their territory since the beginning of their creation stories. Their stories are written on the land, they use their stories to teach their history and virtues. The Ta na wa Yúus ta Stitúyntsaṁ (The person who protects the land) of the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw and the skel7áŵlh (Steward of the land) of the Lilwat7úl are roles shared by all of the responsible and respectable people of their Nations. Historically, there were some who specialized in certain areas but it was a role shared by all. In recent years the roles have been taken up by the Administration Departments who work with partners to care for the land.

This exhibition shares some of the work done to help restore the balance and harmony in the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw (Squamish Nation) territory and the Lilwat7úl (Lil'wat Nation) territory with our neighbours and partners.

Curator Mixalhítsa7 Alison Pascal shares "It has been very interesting to learn more about the roles and responsibilities that we as Lil'wat Nation members have in caring for the land and to learn more about Squamish practices. I look forward to learning even more as people come in to visit the exhibition and connect to it from their own perspectives."
